Dear Parents and Family Members,

The spring semester is in full swing, and students have settled into their classes, schedules, and campus routines. It is a great time for them to explore all that UCF has to offer, including clubs, activities, and our vibrant fraternity and sorority community. We are dedicated to creating a safe and supportive environment where every student can succeed both academically and personally. With that in mind, we want to share some important information about fraternities and sororities at UCF.

UCF is home to 46 officially recognized fraternities and sororities. These groups follow university policies and high standards for safety, conduct, service, and academics. They are guided by student-led councils, the Greek Council, and the professional staff in the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life. Recognized chapters participate in approved education and recruitment processes, with student safety as the top priority.

That said, there are groups that are not officially affiliated with, or recognized by, the university. These include Sigma Chi, Phi Gamma Delta (Fiji), Delta Upsilon, Sigma Pi, Alpha Epsilon Pi, Sigma Nu, the Gazoni Family (former Lambda Chi Alpha members), Machi (former Sigma Chi members), and the DUX Family (former Delta Upsilon members). These groups are not registered student organizations and do not follow university oversight or policies. Additionally, some of these groups are operating without recognition of their respective national organizations.

It is important to understand the risks that may be associated with joining, or being involved with, unrecognized groups. Because they do not have university recognition, these groups may not adhere to our robust policies, risk management procedures, or accountability standards. Additionally, these groups cannot participate in official councils, events, or reserve campus spaces. They are also not permitted to use the university's name or branding.

We hope this information helps you support your student in making safe and informed choices about Greek life. If your student received a bid from one of the groups named above, the organization is not recognized by UCF. To confirm whether your student has joined a recognized group, helpful questions to ask your student include:

- What is the official name of the organization?
- Is this group recognized by UCF?
